- SBA New Forgiveness Application.

## **SBA New Forgiveness Application.**

- EZ Forgiveness Application.
  - Self-employed with no employees;

Or

Did not reduce FTEs or pay by more 25%,

Or

- Could not because of safety orders by:
  - Secretary of Health and Human Services, the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, or the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, BUT
  - Not State shelter in place orders.



- Safe Harbor on FTEs and Salaries.
  - Restored FTEs by Dec. 31, 2020 as had Feb. 15, 2020, and
  - Pay not cut by more than 25% by by Dec. 31, 2020 as paid Feb. 15, 2020.
- Applies as of date of forgiveness application up to Dec. 31, 2020.



- Calculating FTEs and Salaries.
  - Total hours worked per week divided by 40, and
  - Add in non-hourly employees.
- How to calculate first 4 days—Jan. 1 (Wednesday) to Jan.4 (Saturday)?
  - No guidance.
    - Start Jan, 5 or next full pay period?
    - Each pay week paid between Jan. 1 to Feb.29?
    - Proportion first 4 days?



- Limits on owner-employees.
  - Cap on what can pay owner-employee:
    - \$15,385 for 8-week covered period, or
    - \$20,833 for 24-week covered period.
  - Cannot add on:
    - Benefits for owners, (health care expenses and retirement contributions), and
    - State taxes (usually unemployment tax).



- Who is "Owner-Employee"?
  - Files Schedule C,
  - Partnerships, and
  - Sole Proprietors.
  - Unclear as to:
    - LLCs,
    - Subchapter S corps., and
    - C corps.



- Enhanced Transparency
  - PPP loans over \$150,000
  - Will disclose:
    - Business names, addresses, NAICS codes, zip codes, business type, demographic data, and
    - Amount of Loan in ranges:
      - \$150,000-350,000
      - \$350,000-1 million
      - \$1-2 million
      - \$2-5 million
      - \$5-10 million



# **New Restrictions on Testing Employees.**

- Can test employees to determine if currently are infected.
- BUT cannot test employees for COVID-19 antibodies.
  - Violates ADA.
  - Not job related.
- No obligation to accommodate risk to employee's family members.
- EEOC suggested information to provide employees.
  - What You Should Know About COVID-19 and the ADA, the Rehabilitation Act, and other EEOC Laws.



# **New Restrictions on Testing Employees.**

- Be careful not to discriminate.
  - Age,
  - Gender, or
  - Disability.

### **New Guidance on Reopening.**

- The OSHA Guidance:
  - Guidance on Returning to Work, which provides an update on the opening of non-essential businesses.
  - <u>Guidance on Preparing Workplaces for COVID-19</u>, which provides general workplace principles to slow the spread of the coronavirus.
  - <u>Guidance for Stockroom and Loading Dock Workers</u>, which provides "tips" for reducing the exposure to Covid-10 by stockroom workers.
  - <u>Guidance on Social Distancing at Work</u>, which provides a checklist for social distancing at work.
  - <u>Construction Work</u>, which identifies the risk factors and steps to take to limit exposure to COVID-19 for construction sites.



## **New Guidance on Reopening.**

- The OSHA Guidance:
  - Provide suggestions, not enforceable rules.
  - Regularly updated.
  - Also provides posters on:
    - Handwashing hands,
    - Respirators use and maintenance, and
    - Ten Steps All Workplaces Can Take.
  - Go to OSHA Coronavirus Webpage for updates and posters.
  - Massey v. McDonald's Corp.—failed to train on social distancing.



## Potential Legislation and Regulations.

- Pandemic Risk Insurance Act.
  - Fed. Funding.
  - Cover business interruption.
  - As of Jan. 1, 2021.
- Liability immunity.
  - State legislation.
    - Iowa, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Utah, and Wyoming
  - Federal proposal.
  - WFCA Update— Liability Waivers to Protect Against COVID-19 Claims.



# **Potential Legislation and Regulations.**

- New Funding:
  - PPP—\$100 billion remain.
  - New PPP loans.
  - Low Cost Capital Loans.
  - Grants on fixed costs.
  - Retail Relief Fund.
  - Additional Stimulus Checks.



# Potential Legislation and Regulations.

- Tax Relief:
  - Credits to return or retain employees.
  - Credit for PPE and other safety equipment.
  - Credit for training and retraining employees.
  - Payroll Tax Holiday.
  - Tax Reform.
